- \checkmark encourage support for the Rotary Foundation,
- \checkmark conduct a district conference and other meetings, as well as
- ✓ various administrative tasks.

Has our Club had any District Governors? Yes, our club is tied for having the most DG's in the same club (5) with Dover, Portland, Newburyport (no longer in this district) and Portsmouth. Our club's DG's were/are:
