<u>Sue's First Big Check</u> – This week President Sue got to participate in one of the best things about being president – giving away money! We presented the "big check" for \$750 to the Cape Elizabeth Land Trust (our compensation from the Paint for Preservation event for parking cars). CELT Board president Anne Carney accepted the check and described the innovative educational activities that our donation will help support.

This is a one-time fee that allows you to play for the whole season and have your shot at the trophy recently relinquished by last year's winner Mike Tranfaglia.

<u>You've Come a Long Way!</u> – Partners for World Health (PWH) founder Elizabeth McLellan spoke to us a few years ago when the organization had recently moved its location from her dining room to warehouse space. What a long way the organization has come since then! The organization now collects medical waste from hospitals all over New England. PWH has storage sites all over Maine, at the University of Vermont, and they are beginning a collaboration with BU and Tufts as well. Note that they have recently moved to 40 Walch Drive in Portland (opposite the golf course on Riverside Street), through the generous donation of the building they now occupy. PWH Makes a Difference (there's that Rotary theme again!) by:

- Reducing the environmental impact of medical "waste" that would otherwise go to landfills;
- Lowering health care costs (by eliminating disposal fees);
- Redistributing the supplies to the less fortunate;
- Benefitting local communities through the diaper Give Back program; and
- Providing medical mission trips to developing countries.

PWH was recently involved in a Rotary Foundation global grant which provided supplies and equipment to a cancer hospital in Uganda, and also provided medical training to the hospital staff.

Interested in District Service? Our District 7780 bylaws provide a seat on the Finance Committee for each of the three "areas" of our district. This year, the vacancy is for area C, which is chosen by clubs in Cumberland, Lincoln and Sagadahoc counties. The incoming member will take office July 1, 2018 and serve a three-year term. The duties are described in bylaw section 303. The finance committee usually meets in person four or five times per year, and members have duties between those meetings.

This position is not appointed by the district governor. Instead, the clubs must nominate candidates from within their club and the candidate gets selected by the District nominating committee. The deadline is October 15 to apply, and an interview follows, with the selection to **be made before December 1.** Bylaw 303.1 states there is preference given to candidates who have served either as club president or club treasurer, and/or who have accounting or finance as a part of their vocation or profession. Clubs are encouraged to submit applications to the District Nominating Committee. Chair Marty Helman will be happy to answer any questions about the process and requirements.
