Anchors Aweigh – SP/CE Rotary celebrated Navy Week along with the rest of Portland's first ever event. Helping to make it happen was Mike Geneseo, who invited our speaker and also encouraged area clubs to come hear him. Four members of the Portland club accepted the offer as well as one member of the Westbrook-Gorham club. One of the Portland members, former Navy Commander Don Lowry, introduced our speaker.

Commander Kevin Shilling's Navy career spans 2 decades, and has taken him from multiple submarine tours of duty to



leading recruitment for all of New England. He is a graduate of the United States Naval Academy, and holds a bachelor of science degree in history, a master of science degree in human resource management and a master of arts degree in national security and strategic studies. Cdr Shilling was accompanied by Lt. Shay Vickerstaff of Portland, and Gary Ross (retired) of Navy Outreach who put together Cdr. Shilling's presentation.


Commander Shilling gave us a status report on America's Navy, and showed pictures of the oldest ship (USS Constitution, which has just been overhauled) and the newest ship (aircraft carrier USS Ford). Along with humanitarian missions and maintaining readiness for conflict, a large part of what the Navy does is to protect free trade by ensuring that sea lanes remain open. Since 90% of global commerce is conducted by sea, it is vital that ships be able to sail freely.

Cdr. Shilling pointed out that 26% of jobs in our country depend on global trade so the Navy provides a critical service to our economy.
