Got Water? – Our speaker this week, introduced by Mike McGovern, was Carrie Lewis, General Manager of the Portland Water District (PWD). Carrie is originally from Portsmouth but has been living in Canada and Milwaukee until she came back to New England this year. I try not to editorialize about the programs, but Carrie was funny and a great speaker and her presentation was fascinating. She gave us a little history about the PWD, which was founded after the Great Fire of 1866 so that there would be water available to fight fires. The PWD is a quasi-municipal independent non-profit, serving 200,000 customers in 11 communities.

Our water comes from Sebago Lake, and water comes into the lake from as far north as Bethel. Much of that territory that feeds the lake is forested, and the forest acts as a natural filter. Due to that fact and the vigilance of the PWD in keeping the lakewater pure, our water does not have to be filtered by chemicals. The only treatment required is ozone and ultraviolet light – this accounts for the exceptionally pure taste of our water.

What's New with Lonnie? – Many of us have had the pleasure of hearing young Bowdoin graduate Lonnie Hackett speak at our club or the District Conference, and for the rest of us hopefully you'll have that opportunity in the not too distant future. Our club has just approved a \$1,500 contribution to Healthy Kids/Brighter Future's global grant application for a \$200,000 project to add 16 schools and 40,000 children to its network. Lonnie makes it a point to visit clubs to thank them, but he doesn't get the chance very often due to his travels. Since last summer he has been at Oxford University pursuing his master's in public health, and he will be doing a project to complete his degree requirements in South Africa. All the while, staying in contact with the school health workers in Lusaka, Zambia who are the key to the HK/BF program. Lonnie will be speaking at the Presidential Peace Conference in Toronto which occurs right before the RI Convention in 2 weeks (darn – I'll arrive too late!!).
