<u>Preventing Elder Abuse</u> – Our speaker this week was Betty Balderston, Elder Abuse Prevention Advocate for Legal Services for the Elderly in Augusta. Betty spoke about the epidemic of elder abuse, which affects over 33,000 elders in Maine each year. There are several forms of abuse but Betty spoke about the most common one, financial exploitation. Much of this abuse goes unreported because 90% of the abusers are family members. Warning signs of elder abuse

include sudden changes in appearance or personality, social isolation and loss of ability to meet financial obligations. If you suspect elder abuse there are several agencies you can contact, including:
