<u>Leading the Fight for a World Without Cancer</u> – Our speaker this week was Ellen Russell, senior manager of community development for the American Cancer Society Northeast Region and a long-time resident of Cape Elizabeth. The American Cancer Society involves 1.5 million volunteers in attacking cancer from every angle:

- * Research
- Direct Service Programs
- Public Education
- Behavior Change

Ellen reported that there has been a 26% decrease in the cancer mortality rate in the past 20 years so obviously they're doing something right.

In addition to bringing us Maine Restaurant Week, March is also Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. When found early, there is a 90% 5-year survival rate for colorectal cancer. Anamaria gave a firsthand testimony (her father) of the life-saving benefits of screening and encourages everyone over the new screening age of 45 to get screened.

FINAL REPORT ON HOMELESS MAINE VETERANS PROGRAM — It was announced at this week's meeting that unfortunately due to a variety of reasons, we have ended our program to provide items to assist veterans transitioning out of homelessness. (Fortunately one of the reasons is a decrease in the need.) Dan Davidson, who has been the heart and soul of this program made my job easy by preparing a report for the board, which I could not improve upon so I am including word for word as Dan wrote it.

For the record, our Club has provided major assistance through the Maine VA to help Maine's homeless veterans for the past seven Rotary years.

The Club's Committee has been truly outstanding, consisting of Tom Meyers, Doug Schauf, Paul Butler, Tony Wagner, Bob Knupp, Nicole Albert, Joe Conroy, Dan Davidson.

Our primary contact at the Maine Veterans Affairs Office has been Susie Whittington. I have met with her many times and it has been a great relationship. All our efforts have been coordinated through Susie and she has been a joy to work with. She has spoken to our club and many of you have met her and felt her incredible enthusiasm. Her professionalism and dedication to our veterans is truly without parallel. I will sorely miss working with her. She will still be a good friend.

Over the seven years, I was able to reconstruct our monetary contributions in the total amount of <u>about</u> \$37,392. The first year amounts were scattered a bit and not so clear. This total amount includes the Club's line-item budget plus contributions from several individuals including past member Jeff Hobbs who has been very generous.

Finally, since the VA could not do any soliciting or publicity on their own, our Club has repeatedly put out news releases about our efforts and this has resulted in wide exposure for both our Club and for the homeless veterans efforts in Maine.

As Chair, I want to again thank the Club's Homeless Veterans Committee. Everyone ... everyone ... has pitched in with a will and without any complaint and done outstanding work. Your positive attitudes and your exceptional efforts have truly made a difference in helping our veterans ... who have given so much and yet need so much.
