<u>Thank You, SoPo Parks & Recreation</u> (*written by Tony Wagner*) – WinterFest Committee members Kathy Cotter, Betty Egner, Doug Schauf and Tony Wagner, along with Christmas Tree Chair David Lourie hosted a luncheon at Willow's Restaurant last Tuesday. Most of the Department was there including the management team and the ground crews from Wainwright and those who handle all the other parks. All 17 thoroughly enjoyed the meal and fellowship with their Rotary partners.

These folks set up and take down the tree lot snow fence, and keep us plowed out. They also supply equipment and the heavy labor to help us pull off WinterFest during these past 6 years of the partnership between the City and our club. We also work collaboratively on park work, Bug

Light, and other events like Art in the Park, the antique auto show, etc. Each and every one made a special effort to thank us for this annual celebration.

<u>WinterFest Results</u> (*drum roll please*) – Tony announced the final figures for this year's WinterFest. We netted \$51,000 (up from \$41,000 last year)! Of that, \$13,000 is earmarked for our partner, the City of South Portland, and the remaining \$38,000 is ours to spend on our club projects. In addition to these bottom line figures, Tony also tallied:

- ✓ 670 volunteer hours
- ✓ 100 participating businesses
- ✓ \$67 net/person hour (up from \$45 last year)

Our major sponsors were Bath Savings Institution, Saco & Biddeford Savings Institution, Port Harbor Marine and DiMillo's. Thanks to these sponsors, all the other participating businesses, the city of SP, the WinterFest committee and all of YOU who helped make it happen!

<u>A Life-Saving Organization</u> – That's how everyone at the Animal Refuge League of Greater Portland views their organization. Their Executive Director Patsy Murphy was our speaker this week and she shared the history of the organization. It was founded in 1911 by Gov. Percival Baxter at the request of some women from the West End who were concerned about the welfare of horses. In 1956 the organization moved to its present location in Stroudwater and in 2016 completed a big expansion of their facility. This expansion greatly improved the quality of life for the animals because they don't have to be kept in cages. ARLGP's mission is to nurture the connection between people and pets. As part of carrying out that mission, they have two teachers on staff who conduct humane education classes – last year they reached 10,500 students!

Over 4,000 animals went through the organization last year – and nearly all of them were adopted. Many of these animals came from other parts of the country – as far away as California and Puerto Rico. Had it not been for the willingness and availability of the ARLGP, these animals probably would not have lived. Therefore they are truly a life-saving organization.
