Puerto Rico and Rotaract – Our speaker this week was Sheila Rollins from the Bridgton Lakes-Region Rotary club. Sheila was our District Governor in 2015-16 and since then has been the District's Rotaract chair. Rotaract clubs are made up of service-minded young people ages 18-30 (often college students). There are two in our district – one at UNH and one at St. Joseph's College. In order to experience the value of a service project firsthand, the Rotaract members went to Puerto Rico in March and again in May to repair people's homes that were damaged in Hurricane Maria. Their trips were funded by a district grant from The Rotary Foundation, as well as many clubs and individual Rotarians in our district. Maria was the most damaging hurricane to ever hit Puerto Rico and many people are still homeless. Sheila pointed out that the devastation was uneven so the coastal areas tend to be in much better shape than the inland region. The students worked with a nonprofit organization called Pathstone that provided the materials and coordinated the projects. Sheila shared several pictures from the March trip as well as reflections from the students on what they learned from the trip. She just got back from the 2nd trip on Sunday though (!) so to see pictures and get more information about the most recent trip, you can go to RotaryFest (aka the District Conference) on Saturday, June 22 and hear all about it.

<u>2019 District Conference – RotaryFest (submitted by Scott Irving)</u>

This year's district conference is called RotaryFest and will be held at Fort Williams on June 22. In case of bad weather it will move inside. There will be no cost for Rotarians from the district to attend.

Volunteers are being recruited from across the district. As the home club of DG John Lobosco, it would be terrific if many SPCE members were present and helping to show our support for him. The goal is many people working short blocks of time, so they can spend most of their time attending other parts of the conference. A free BBQ lunch is included in the conference. The tasks needing volunteers include the following: Friday

- Foundation point Duck pool fundraisers (9-11, 11-1, 1-3)
- Craft, Face painting, bounce tent, fairy hair, and kite making (9-11:45, 1:15-3, 2:45-4:15)
- Tent takedown (4:30-7) need 5 more people
- Site cleanup (4:30-7)
- Other helpers can be used, if your schedule doesn't fit well.
- Trucks We'll need a few trucks during set up and take down.

Note that the exact numbers of people needed is unknown to me as I write this. But I wanted to let you know so you could plan.
