- ➤ Dan Davidson is our PR Guy Emeritus. While no longer holding an official title, we can count on Dan to send us photos and bits of news.

<u>K-9s on the Front Line (7/31 program)</u> – Veterans in Maine with PTSD and other combatrelated issues have found help ... with service dogs provided by K-9s on the Front Line, a non-profit that trains and provides former shelter dogs to Maine veterans at no cost to the veteran.

Linda Murray, a co-founder (in 2016) and an unpaid volunteer, gave us a sensitive and informative program, assisted by volunteer Katie Kinney (who Tony Wagner and Dan Davidson met some time ago and added to our program list). The program began with a five-minute emotional video. The cost to train and provide a dog is \$3,500. There is no government funding; all money raised is from donations. Some 150 dogs have been provided so far. The dogs are trained to neutralize negative emotions, help reduce flashbacks, and also reduce depression, anxiety and stresses ... and are trained for specific tasks by Law Enforcement K-9 handlers. There is a list of requirements for a veteran to qualify for a dog. This is truly and noble and worthwhile effort being done by volunteers here in Maine.

<u>DIVERSIFY!!! (8/7 program)</u> – This was a key message by our speaker Todd Robbins, the Cape Elizabeth tree warden. The tree canopy in Cape Elizabeth is made up 40% by red oaks, a host to winter moths, and 90% is comprised of oaks, maples and pines. This is not good news for the future of trees in Cape Elizabeth, so Todd is trying to spread the word about the importance of planting a variety of trees so that the canopy will not be so vulnerable to one or two types of insects. To that end, several different species of trees have been planted on Officers' Row in Fort Williams – hickory, American linden, American sycamore and tupelo. (Some club members were disappointed to learn that he also likes sumac!) Todd's philosophy is that his job is to protect people from trees, but also to protect trees from people. The club enjoyed a lively Q&A discussion about trees, pests and how to prevent losing trees.

Re-Run Alert!! – With apologies to everyone who remembers this article from last year (and the year before, and the year before, and the year before!), I am trotting out the following information for the 5th consecutive year for the benefit of new members in preparation for the "Official Visit" next week.

What's a District Governor? I had the bright idea of going to the Rotary website for a definition – here's the definition in the bylaws (Article 1, #5): "the governor of a Rotary district." Don't you feel enlightened now? Elsewhere on the website it indicates that a District Governor (DG) should:

- ✓ strengthen clubs and grow membership,
- ✓ serve as a spokesperson for the district,
- ✓ encourage support for the Rotary Foundation,
- ✓ conduct a district conference and other meetings, as well as
- ✓ various administrative tasks.

Who is our District Governor? Andy Glazier of the Kittery club is our current District Governor; his term started on July 1. Andy's Rotary story is similar to Fran Bagdasarian's – i.e. a relatively recent true Rotarian, but he has been a Rotarian in spirit for many many years since "first lady" Pam Gray is a long-time Rotarian. Andy is a builder by trade and next week he will tell us all about how he hopes we will all "build" Rotary during the upcoming year.
