<u>SP-CE Rotary and Veterans</u> – In the 2012-13 Rotary year, our club formed a Veterans Committee, aimed primarily at supporting homeless veterans in their transition to employment and housing. From 2012 through June, 2019, our club has spent just over \$40,000 in assisting veterans. Until recently, we worked in collaboration with the VA to provide items that it was difficult for them to provide in their budget directly to veterans: bus passes, gas cards, grocery store gift cards, bedding, pots & pans and other items needed to go from living on the street to having their own apartments. Due to bureaucratic issues, that working relationship with the VA ended recently, but we have found a new partner to work with to accomplish the same mission.

We heard this week from Mike Merrill, Program Manager for the Arthur B. Huot House in Saco and the Veterans Career House in Biddeford. Both residences are operated by Volunteers of

America, Northern New England and provide transitional housing. VOA-NNE also has a permanent residence community for veterans called Cabin in the Woods near Togus. The Huot House is named after Navy veteran Arthur B. Huot who believed that "It's the day by day acts of kindness that change the world." Our club has been trading kindnesses with the veterans served by the two Houses – we donated \$2,500 and the veterans provided valuable manpower at our tree unloadings, Mike described exactly what our donation was used for – the purchase of 4 beds (5 if you count the fact that Hub Furniture threw in an extra bed) and a desktop computer with a locking device to prevent it being stolen. Veterans use the computer to assist with employment and housing searches and to stay connected with their families. It's fair to say that Dan and the rest of the committee are very pleased with the way our new partnership is working out.
