“Building a Reservoir of Trust” – Our speaker this week, Cape Elizabeth Police Chief Paul Fenton, summarized his goals and plans for the CEPD as just that, building a reservoir of trust. He outlined some of the ways that his department is trying to do that – the School Resource Officer (SRO), Coffee with a Cop, Senior Scams Awareness programs, and overall responsiveness to concerns raised by citizens about speeding in their neighborhoods and dogs on the beach. He remarked that officers who come to CEPD from other cities are surprised that the CE citizens actually wave at them. He was proud that all of the officers in the department have a college degree of some kind, and 5 of the 14 officers in the department have a master’s degree. Many in the audience expressed their appreciation of the work done by the CEPD and we look forward to an even closer relationship with them.

Fort Williams Work Project – Scott Irving received a very nice note from Andrea Southworth, the Ecology Project manager at Fort Williams concerning the work project that Rotarians from around the district did at the fort on the afternoon before RotaryFest. Andrea was very appreciative of the work that was done there, and it is estimated that the work done by Rotarians that day was worth about \$8,000. Here is an excerpt from her note:

“It would be difficult for me to estimate the value of the work that you all did near the Fire Barn. It's almost incalculable because you changed this from a dense, overgrown area to a lovely wooded hillside with ocean views. You changed it so that people will want to walk through this area. The Fort Williams Park Committee site walk is going to be this Thursday night, and I am so excited to show them. I'm hoping that they will want to put resources into this area in the future.”
