




**Beautifying Fort Williams (as if it wasn't already beautiful enough)** – Helping to weed, spread mulch, etc. this week were:

**The Lumbery** – Our speaker this week was Michael Friedland, who owns Willard Square Home Repair. Michael is originally from Brooklyn and never saw fruit growing on a tree until he was 21 – so no wonder Maine appeals to him. He is making plans to open a new business, The Lumbery, which will be located at the old Cumberland Farms in the center of Cape Elizabeth. The motivation for the new business was that the closest place to get lumber is a half hour away. And the lumber at Lowe's and Home Depot comes from the South and the West Coast – none from Maine. His new business will sell lumber from small mills all over Maine. Michael is encouraged that the quality of the lumber that he has been buying from these mills is so much better than what is currently available locally. The new business will also feature a tool lending library, and eventually will offer classes. He hopes to open in mid-September.
