Williams gardeners who planted 36 perennials yesterday. The gardeners also included Catherine, Bev, Phil, Peter Bennett and CEHS Scholarship recipient Isabelle Berman with her brother. <u>Christmas Trees – It's a Go!</u> – Much of last night's Board meeting was devoted to a discussion of the tree sale and an authorization to order the trees. (For anyone who missed the meeting in which the tree sale was discussed, we are planning to sell trees online, in addition to sales on the lot which will presumably be scaled back.) Dave Bagdasarian reported that a tree sale committee of about 10 people has been formed and they are exploring MANY aspects of the tree sale. If you haven't responded to the survey about your participation in the tree sale, please do so. Note that it does not commit you to anything. Preliminary results from the survey indicate – as you would imagine – that we cannot count on as much manpower from within our club to operate the sale. The committee will be working out the details as to how to "pivot" (I think that's the buzzword for what all our local businesses are doing these days).

The tree order represents a slight reduction in total number of trees (with some change in the mixture) and an increase in the number of wreaths. The board unanimously authorized Dave to go ahead and place the order. Thank you to everyone on the committee who are tackling a myriad of logistical considerations, as well as designing a website and formulating an effective marketing strategy.

<u>Rotary Responds Live</u> – RI's General Secretary John Hewko conducts a weekly Facebook Live session in which he hosts various Rotary leaders and partners. This week one of his two guests (along with someone from USAID) was a member of the Rotary Club of South Portland-Cape Elizabeth (which Hewko actually said twice) – of course Mike McGovern. Mike talked about the impact of COVID-19 on polio eradication and (more importantly) vice versa. Mike spoke about the crucial role that the polio contact tracing infrastructure has played in tracing COVID-19 infections. He also shared the good news that Pakistan expects to be able to resume house-to-house immunizations at the end of July.
