<u>Vet to Vet Maine</u> – How fitting that we follow up Veteran's Day with a program about a brand new organization that serves veterans. Bob Knupp introduced his friend and fellow Cumberland resident Tom Gruber. Tom is an Army veteran who is on the board of several organizations, as well as serving as a town councilor in Cumberland for 9 years. He is the Vice President of Vet2Vet and has been with them since its inception as a program of the Southern Maine Area Agency on Aging. They realized that the program had the capacity to serve more than just aging veterans so they spun off recently as their own charity.

Vet2Vet pairs veterans of all ages – but primarily elderly veterans and veterans adjusting to civilian life – with trained veteran volunteers. The volunteers visit their assigned veteran at least twice a month and provide companionship, offer assistance with benefits, and support independent living. Tom told us that he had been assigned to two World War II veterans (one was a driver for General Patton!) and is waiting to meet a third veteran who has been assigned to him.

Vet2Vet currently serves 70 veterans in Cumberland County, but the organization hopes to expand statewide.



<u>Dining Table Decorations</u> – As you probably know, we have "red bags" and "polio cans" on our tables every week at Purpoodock. For those not familiar with what goes in these, here's a rundown:

- ★ Polio cans pretty self-explanatory. This is for your spare change or paper money and is sent in to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) for polio eradication a couple times a year.
- Red bags this money is also sent to The Rotary Foundation, but much more frequently and the money goes to the Annual Fund. There are blank envelopes in the red bags that you can put your cash in and write your name on the envelope. The money will be submitted to TRF under your name, and you should receive a receipt from TRF shortly after it's sent in.

Note that there was \$45 cash in the bags with no name attached (a 20, a 10 and three 5's) – if you put this in, let me know so you can get credit for it. (But remember the 4-Way Test #1 – Is it the truth? – I don't want to hear from all of you that it was yours!)
