Welcome, Brent! – Laurenz introduced our newest member this week, Brent Wilson. Brent (not to be confused with Jim Britt) is a senior property manager at Westbrook Housing. He grew up in North Carolina where he attended the University of North Carolina. After that he worked in Ireland, Scotland, Montana and North Carolina, much of that work being for homeless shelters. Brent and his wife are South Portland residents and he is very interested in improving the lives of our community members. He reported that at his first meeting Tony and Sari spoke about what they've been doing with the SP schools and that motivated him to continue coming to meetings and find out more about us. We're so glad to have Brent with us and look forward to being able to participate with him on service projects in the not too distant future (some members are already wanting him to sign up for tree shifts!).



<u>Literary Degrees of Kevin Bacon</u> – There are only a couple degrees of separation by way of books between our new member Brent and our speaker this week! Not sure exactly how you count it when there are books involved but here's the chain:

- Brent has walked the Camino de Santiago, which ends at Santiago de Compostela in northwest Spain.
- Australian author Graeme Simsion wrote a book recently about walking the Camino de Santiago entitled <u>Two Steps Forward</u>.
- The same author's first novel <u>The Rosie Project</u> features a hero who is on the autism spectrum, which was our speaker's topic this week.

(Granted there's a shorter connection if you just say that they both know President Mike!)

<u>Autism Superheroes</u> – Our speaker this week was Catherine McGuckin from Woodfords Family Services, which provides support to people with special needs. While based in Westbrook, it actually serves 13 of Maine's counties. Woodfords is currently serving 103 individuals in South Portland and Cape Elizabeth, about 2/3 of whom are children.

Cathy's topic was "Autism Awareness, Acceptance and Advocacy." She personalized her talk by telling about her nephew who was diagnosed with autism at a young age. He is currently pursuing a master's degree, but were it not for the type of services provided by Woodfords, he would not be thriving today. As Rotarians we were relieved to hear her comment that vaccines have been studied extensively as a potential cause of autism but there is no evidence that they play any role in causing autism.
