**Pandemic Heroes, Part I** – Back in December Betty Egner, on behalf of the Foundation Committee, collected nominations for local “Pandemic Heroes.” Thank you to everyone who submitted nominations and to Betty for coordinating everything. This week we made presentations to representatives from two entities who were outstanding representatives of the many organizations and businesses that were challenged and stepped up in the past year. Anne Swift-Kayatta introduced the first three awardees and there would be nothing to be gained by editing her script so here it is.



Tonight we are honoring three pandemic heroes from Pinnacle Health and Rehab:

- ❖ Becca Ivey-Geneseo, RN—Assistant Director of Nursing, Infection Control & Prevention Officer,
- ❖ Laurie Bagley, RN—Director of Nursing, and
- ❖ Nikki Mowatt, LPN—Education Coordinator.

Becca, Laurie and Nikki make up the infection control team at Pinnacle Health & Rehab of South Portland and have been working to protect the residents, staff and community since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic.

As many of you may know, Pinnacle was until recently known as South Portland Nursing Home and has been providing residential care to some of the area's most vulnerable residents for decades. Pinnacle's residents include seniors in need of medical and residential care, adults with developmental disabilities unable to live on their own, and patients experiencing advanced Alzheimer's and dementia.

Both nursing home residents and staff are considered to be at high risk for contracting disease due to the congregate setting of skilled, long-term care facilities.

The unit that these three professionals comprise has been responsible for more than a thousand negative tests, has put in place safeguards to ensure the safety and ongoing health of their 65 residents, and has engaged in an ongoing internal public information campaign to reinforce best practices in the facility and to provide accurate and relevant information to residents, their families, staff, and others.

Over the past year, their efforts have:

- Avoided all outbreaks of COVID in the facility and ensured that no resident contracted the virus. (To be clear, there have been positives in staff [in staff only,

not residents], but each instance it has been contained, did not spread within the facility or among the population, and did not result in serious illness.)

- Achieved a 97% inoculation rate among residents. According to the CDC, the national average\* is 78%.
- Achieved a ~70% inoculation rate among staff, compared to a national average\* of 38%.
- Operated two vaccination events in which no doses were wasted or destroyed.
- Continued to coordinate ongoing vaccination efforts for new residents and staff.

[\* according to CDC report Feb 2021; averages are median figures]


For all these achievements and more to help our community, especially the most vulnerable among us, the Rotary Foundation is awarding Paul Harris Fellow status to Becca, Laurie and Nikki as representatives of all the staff at Pinnacle Health and Rehab of South Portland. Congratulations and thank you!

**Pandemic Heroes, Part II** – The second organization that we honored was the South Portland Food Cupboard, and receiving Paul Harris Fellow certificates were Dwayne Hopkins, Executive Director and Jim Welch, Warehouse Manager. Tony introduced Dwayne, who has been at the Food Cupboard for four years, replacing Sybil as the Executive Director. (And it should be noted that the Food Cupboard would not even exist without Sybil’s founding and nurturing of it for nearly two decades – and it still bears her imprint in its emphasis on quality of the food and respect for the customers.) Sybil had big shoes to fill but Tony and Sari both noted Dwayne’s excellent leadership.

Sari introduced Jim Welch, whom she described as:

- A force of nature,
- A Food Cupboard Encyclopedia, and
- It’s in his DNA to go the extra mile!

Dwayne and Jim noted that they were able to join us at our Zoom meeting on a computer that our club donated to the Food Cupboard!
