Upstairs, Inc. – Otherwise known as the Cape Courier. The Cape Courier was started by a woman in her basement and as it grew she moved upstairs, hence the name of the business that publishes the Cape Courier. We learned this from its publisher Tara Simopoulos who was our speaker this week. Tara is from Toronto and moved to Cape in 2010 with her husband and two children. The Courier is delivered free of charge to about 4,800 households in Cape Elizabeth. It is not a non-profit as far as the IRS is concerned (i.e. not a 501(c)(3)) but it is a non-profit in the sense that it never makes a profit! In fact they found that they needed to conduct a fundraiser last year, which was very successful. The pandemic created a large drop in ad sales such that they are in need of cash again, and next month will start asking for voluntary subscriptions. Another impact of the pandemic was that with everything shut down, there wasn't much news!



OUT OF AFRICA!! – It was officially announced and celebrated on Tuesday that the wild polio virus has been eliminated in all 47 countries on the entire continent of Africa. This is a huge milestone and would have been completely inconceivable 40 years ago. That just leaves two countries in the world (Pakistan & Afghanistan) where polio is still endemic. Although it was overlooked in some media stories about the milestone, this would NEVER have happened without Rotary. The eradication of polio in all but these 2 countries occurred because of the vision and dedication of many Rotarian pioneers whose names are hardly ever heard anymore so I'm going to list a few here:

- Dr. John Sever
- RI President (1984-85) Dr. Carlos Canseco
- Honorary Rotarian Dr. Albert Sabin
- Dr. Robert Scott

Each of these, along with many others, played a critical role in planning a strategy for immunizing children and raising funds for vaccinations and their delivery. The work has been led in recent years by Past RI President John Germ and our own Michael McGovern. And we as SPCE Rotarians are also playing our own small role in polio eradication through our club and individual contributions to PolioPlus. Well done, everyone!!!
