<u>From the Board Room</u> – The Board met following our club meeting on Wednesday and took these actions:

- ➤ Confirmed that we will make our customary Christmas bonus of \$250 to our server Shannon, despite the fact that we have not been meeting there for a while, or actually *especially because* we haven't been meeting there for a while.
- A donation to The Rotary Foundation earmarked for the Environment in celebration of RI Past President Mark Maloney speaking to our club on January 13.
- ➤ Committed to a donation of \$1,000 to a grant that the Boothbay Harbor Club is applying for which will build a toilet block and plant fruit trees in a community in Uganda. The toilet block is especially needed due to the high incidence of cholera in that community.
- ➤ A donation of \$500 to a clean water project in Costa Rica this was a grant that the Rotary Club of Ithaca approached us about during John LoBosco's year as District Governor and they finally received their grant funding.
- ➤ It was noted that we received a donation of \$1,000 earmarked for Bug Light, so this will increase the amount available in our budget to spend on the lighthouse.
