As a result of that long history of donations, they recently achieved what the Foundation calls Level 2 Major Donor (for inquiring minds, that represents cumulative giving of \$25,000). Mike McGovern announced that they had achieved this milestone and on behalf of the Foundation President Mark congratulated and thanked Tony and his family. Since this was a recognition of the family's generosity, we were joined in the meeting by daughters Stephanie Bernard and Amy Carroll, sons Matt and Andrew Wagner, Tony's sister Carol and a few grandchildren. In an email after the meeting, Tony also thanked Bill York for introducing him to Rotary 39 years ago.

A Presidential Year Unlike Any Other - Thanks to our current remote environment, our little club in the upper right corner of the country can have the privilege of having a Past President of RI as the speaker at our weekly meeting, even though it's the dead of winter and no one would use lobster in Maine as an excuse to visit Maine in January. But thanks to Zoom meetings we had exactly that privilege this week. President Mark spoke to us about what it was like to be the president of RI – to go from his "day job" of a lawyer in a small town in Alabama, to representing Rotary at the top levels. In that position he had the honor of meeting with presidents of several countries and was even scheduled to meet with the Pope (although it was supposed to happen in May so obviously it didn't happen). He told a very moving story of his experience volunteering with Operation Smile (similar to Rotaplast, which our district has participated in) and observing the surgery of a baby with a cleft palate and then handing the baby to her father. This experience encapsulated what he thinks Rotary is all about – "making lives better for those less fortunate than ourselves." In appreciation for speaking to our club, the club made a donation of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation (not counted in the numbers above) in his honor, to be earmarked for Environmental causes.
