

<u>June 23 Program</u> – Thank you to both Bob Knupp & Nicole Albert for taking notes at the June 23 meeting! Here are Bob's notes about the program:

Laurenz Schmidt spoke to the Club about his employment with a Biomass entity. His focus there is on the technical side of the operation. Biomass Pellets reduce the production of CO2 which has reached an all time high of 421.36 units as of 2000 compared with 288.2 in 1870. There has been a significant rise in temperatures from 1996 to 2000. Coal and oil fired power plants produce great amounts of CO2. Biomass products come from forests and, when harvested, can be substituted at power plants. The CO2 emitted from burning pellets is returned to the atmosphere and absorbed by forests through photosynthesis, completing the cycle. Laurenz shared a number of slides, some of which were technical in nature. His final slide showed the payback time for conversion from a fossil fuel plant to a biomass plant of about seven years. Biomass pellets can be used for home heating.

- ✓ Donations to various facets of the community of over \$46,000 in the area of Community Service, \$15,000 in Youth Service and \$2,000 in International Service (on top of the Foundation donations)
- ✓ Nine new members and two more approved for membership in spite of (or maybe because of) not getting to know us in person.
- ✓ A 5-year high Rotary Foundation Annual Fund per capita giving of \$271 per member. Club and individual donations totaled \$14,642 to the Annual Fund and \$13,770 to PolioPlus.
- ✓ New Projects such as distributing our area's share of masks in the Million Mask Challenge
- ✓ An unbelievably successful Tree Sale, in which Dave Bagdasarian and his team renovated a 50-year-old model of selling trees.
- ✓ Extremely active participation at the South Portland Food Cupboard
- ✓ Helping homeless students in the South Portland Schools
- ✓ Maintaining "glorious and vibrant" gardens at Fort Williams picnic shelter and Bug Light Park (they really are – check them out!)

- ✓ Interesting and informative speakers
- ✓ Outstanding publicity through the press and FaceBook
- ✓ Ongoing support of veterans in our communities
