

In presenting the award, District Governor Peggy Belanger said that her intent is that the new members use the award money for a project of their choosing.

<u>Milestone Recovery</u> – Our speaker this week was Oliver Bradeen, Executive Director of Milestone Recovery. Oliver joined Milestone last October after formerly serving as the Substance Use Liaison for the City of Portland. Milestone is a nonprofit detox center and treats Maine residents on a sliding fee scale without regard for the ability to pay. They have 16 co-ed beds in their facility on India Street. Oliver explained the history of Milestone's forced shutdowns during the pandemic. These shutdowns caused them to lose staff, and now that they can re-open again they had a hard time attracting nursing staff since the pandemic utilized all available healthcare workers. But thanks to our club donation of \$2,000 as well as the ability to secure additional funding from the state, they were able to increase their nursing salaries and are once again fully staffed. Be watching for an announcement in the next week or so about the reopening of the facility!



<u>Are vou Local or From Away?</u> – I just had to share this with you because it tickled my funnybone – I actually laughed out loud when I read it. First of all, a huge thank you to Dan McDonald and John LoBosco who have been working with SMCC to create a draft gift agreement to donate our Scholarship Fund to the college.
