<u>Get Vaxed and Give Back!</u> – Many of our club members have been vaccinated and all at no cost to us individually. In gratitude for the privilege of being vaccinated, many have accepted the challenge to express that gratitude with a donation to PolioPlus. We're keeping a tally so if you'd like to be counted, *solely for the purpose of a count of how many have donated*, please let me know.

<u>Money, Money!</u> - Our Board has been very busy lately making sure that we use our profits from tree sales and WinterFest to give back to the community. Here are some recent expenditures that the club will be making/has made:

- \$ Help for Houseless Students in addition to the \$3,500 that was highlighted in the bulletin two weeks ago, the board determined that there is more need (both in SP and CE) and authorized an additional \$1,000 in Target gift cards, \$1,000 in Hannaford gift cards and up to \$2,500 for more backpacks.
- \$ Veterans the board authorized donating a total of \$8,416 to the organizations recommended by the Veterans Committee: Arthur B. Huot House, K-9s on the Front Line, Durham Warriors and Vet2Vet.
- \$ Sounds by the Sea the club is donating \$1,000 to be a sponsor of 6 outdoor concerts to take place this summer at Fort Williams.
- \$ South Portland Skate Park the club is donating \$1,000 towards the construction of the skate park.
- \$ Locker Project the club is donating \$500 to this project which will assist with students with food insufficiency in three South Portland Schools.
- \$ Cape Elizabeth Little League donation of \$500.
- \$ South Portland Football team in appreciation of their invaluable assistance with the tree sale, the club will donate the cost of a pizza party for those students who helped out.
- \$ South Portland Food Cupboard the club will be donating the remaining \$3,500 budgeted for the SP Food Cupboard it will be used for repairs, shelving and a new stove.

<u>Councilor Deqa Dhalac</u> – Patty Sprague introduced our speaker SP City Councilor Deqa Dhalac, who has an impressive resume. Originally from Somalia, she came to the US in 1992 and has lived in South Portland for over ten years. Among other volunteer responsibilities, she has been board president of the Maine Immigrant Rights Coalition and the Maine Womens Fund.

As a new Mainer in Lewiston, she became involved with Emerge Maine, through which she got the idea to run for office. Her oldest son pointed out all the reasons that people might not be open to listening to her (being a black Muslim immigrant woman), but her other children pointed out that these were all the more reasons that she should run and represent those communities. Fortunately for the citizens of South Portland she decided to run and was elected to City Council. Her major accomplishment has been her role in forming the city's Human Rights Commission. Note that the name does not address any particular segment of the city, but was intentionally formed to cover any groups that may feel like they are outsiders.

Dega listed some of the other topics that the City Council is currently working on:

- ➤ Climate crisis
- > Improving diversity
- ➤ Affordable housing
- > Supporting public health and human services, especially for houseless students.
