Good News! -

- ❖ Even though we haven't received any trees yet, we have already sold over \$2,000 to 31 customers! That includes some residents of Great Diamond Island who will receive their trees in the same Casco Bay Lines delivery run as the customers on Long Island (thank you, Matt McAleney!).
- So far it seems a higher percentage than usual are adding a voluntary donation to their tree purchase!
- ❖ Members of the SPHS football & basketball teams will be helping up unload trees!!
- ❖ Tony reports that over 90% of the WinterFest sponsors have re-upped and some have increased their donations!

TREES, TREES!!! – Our meeting this week was completely devoted to the tree sale and the changes that are necessary this year. The club is basically divided into 3 different "crews" with different responsibilities and each crew has been given tailored guidance from the Tree Sale Committee. So I won't go into details but here are some basic take-aways that Dave went over:

- Masks/face coverings are required for everyone on the lot.
- ▲ Lot hours have been reduced: 4-8 on weekdays and 10-8 on Saturday/Sunday.
- ♣ The entrance to the lot has been moved the old entrance is now the exit and the new exit

- is halfway down towards Hannaford. The curbside pickup location is even further down.
- ♠ We are going to avoid tying trees on cars to the extent possible please use good judgment.
- ▶ We ARE still putting cuts on trees for customers.
- ♣ We discourage cash payments if customers pay with cash, we will not make change. (If the customers have bought a lobster roll at Fort Williams this summer, they should not be surprised that we're asking them to pay by credit card!)
- ♣ Salespeople working on the lot need to know how to use the iPad purchased by the club for processing transactions with the Shopify POS app (it's the blue Shopify icon, not the green one). It is very easy − easier than the Square − but if you want a lesson, a tutorial will be provided at the setup on Saturday. Also feel free to call the Bagdasarians (Fran or Dave Sr.) to have one of them walk you through it.
- ▲ IN GENERAL, curbside personnel will not be using the iPad but if the backup iPad is not in use on the main lot, the curbside workers may use it to make additional sales (i.e someone bought a tree online but when they come to pick it up they decide they want a wreath also). So if you are going to be working on the lot at all, please familiarize yourself with the iPad sales procedures.
- ♣ The sales personnel working from home have received their own set of guidelines orchestrated by Anne.
- ▲ Mike McGovern and Betty will be monitoring the sign-up schedule to make sure we're not short on any shifts.
