<u>International Project in our own Backyard</u> – Every year our Rotary district has an international cultural exchange – for instance Catherine Callahan and former member Anamaria Gonzalez went on a trip to Bulgaria. This year the cultural exchange trip will be in North America (northern Maine/Canada – possibly Montreal) and will focus on indigenous peoples. The trip (or possible two trips) will take place in the spring (exact timing to be determined by COVID-19 restrictions at the time). <u>TREES!</u> – Dave Bagdasarian presented our program this week, which was a very informative description of how this year's tree sale will differ from past years. He covered a LOT of information so this is not a comprehensive summary but here are some of the highlights – we will hear more in the upcoming 6 weeks (yikes, that's all!).

- ♣ We have ordered 1950 trees and unlike prior years, we have not ordered any "utility" trees if customers order sight unseen, we want to make sure they receive a quality tree.
- ♣ Since the trailer will not be available for the entire shift to hang out, the shifts will be shorter two hours each, and therefore those working on the lot will be asked to sign up for 6 shifts.
- ♣ Hours that the lot is open will be curtailed from 2-8 or 4-8 on weekdays (whether we open at 2 or 4 will depend on where we are in the sale early, middle or late).
- ♣ We will be needing online workers as well to provide customer support to people using the online website.
- ♣ The lot will be expanded and re-designed to allow for greater spacing between racks. There will be an entrance and a separate exit, as well as an additional opening for curbside pickup for online customers.
- ♣ We will be selling some of the trees to residents of Long Island and potentially other islands as well.
- ♣ We will be encouraging credit card sales only. If customers need to pay with cash, we will not make change. We have a new ipad for processing credit card sales which has several advantages over the Square on the phone that we were using in prior years.
- ▶ We have a publicity campaign ready to launch which includes interviews and targeted FaceBook ads.
- Editor's note There will be cookies for workers, packaged individually.
