He was an electrician and taught his trade for many years at a vocational high school in Framingham, Mass. He was also involved with young people through his role as long-time youth hockey coach.

Revival of Youth Exchange – Rotary Youth Exchange has been on hiatus for a couple years but it is returning this summer and our club will be sponsoring a Short-Term exchange student. Liam Murphy is currently a sophomore at the Baxter School and has requested Spain, Italy, France and Denmark as his exchange countries. After spending 3(?) weeks with a host family in July, he will return home along with a student from his host family who will spend time at Liam's home. There is no commitment required from our club, but we will have the benefit of meeting Liam and his host brother or sister. Thanks to International Service Director Peter Bennett for facilitating this.

Another Revival – For similar reasons our district has not been able to hold RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) since 2019. RYLA is a leadership training course for high school sophomores held in a camp environment (specifically Camp Hinds). This is completely free to students, and students who have attended rave about the experience. They will be accepting applications right up until mid-June (the camp is June 22-26) so if you know of any students who might benefit, please pass the word (you can refer anyone interested to ryla7780.org).

Medecins Sans Frontieres (Doctors Without Borders) – Our speaker this week was Dan McDonald's daughter Julia who seems to embody Service Above Self. She spent two years in the Peace Corps in Morocco, which motivated her to become a doctor. She is currently a family physician at the Family Medicine Institute in Augusta. She is also on the faculty of the Maine-Dartmouth Family Medicine Residency Program and was the 2019 Maine Family Physician of the Year. She has traveled to Honduras every year to provide medical services and was finally able to realize her dream of volunteering for Doctors Without Borders for a year. She served first in Ethiopia and then later in the Democratic Republic of Congo. While there, her function wasn't to see patients directly but to train others. She spoke about the high incidence of maternal mortality in Africa and the ways that it can be combated: sex education, access to contraception and access to abortion.

Dr. McDonald will be heading to Honduras again in May so several members of the club brought a variety of small medical items (over the counter drugs, band-aids, etc.) for her to take with her. We have been hearing through Dan of her adventures with Doctors Without Borders so it was great to have a chance to hear from her firsthand.
