Greater Portland Family Promise — Brent Wilson, who is a board member of Greater Portland Family Promise (he was hooked on the program due to volunteering with them in Montana), introduced Michelle Lamm, Executive Director. GPFP's mission is to "help families experiencing homelessness and low-income families achieve sustainable independence through a community-based response." Pre-pandemic, the program housed homeless families in area churches/temples on a rotating basis and provided case management services to help them find homes. While many of the families are still matched with a congregation, the focus of the program is now more sharply focused on helping families find homes and on providing auxiliary services (laundry, transportation, helping them get food stamps, etc.). It takes about 4-6 months to get families out of motels and into apartments. Their goal is to move two families per month but in December they moved six families! Michelle described the difficulty for these families to make ends meet — after paying rent there is often as little as \$200/month remaining to pay for food and all the other needs of a family. In recognition of the good work they do (most of it based in South Portland), our board recently approved a donation of \$2,500 to Greater Portland Family Promise.





<u>Fireworks in February?!?!</u> – The fireworks crew reported that we had about twice as many people attending the fireworks at Fort Williams on Saturday as we were expecting (based on a wag!) – they even had to close the gate! They were a tremendous success and a great way to bring the community together, which was the goal of our WinterFest committee. Many thanks to the WinterFest Committee leaders Patty and Sari, as well as Tony (who made it all happen) and all the volunteers who stood in the cold to help park cars at the fort.
