<u>Our International Dollars at Work</u> – The Freeport club applied for a Rotary Foundation Global Grant to which our club donated \$750. Peter Bennett attended their club meeting this week at which they heard a report on progress to date. The grant helps farmers in western Kenya to learn how to transition from maize and beans to high value crops which can improve their economic circumstances. The selected families are in the process right now of learning in small groups from interns hired by the grant to teach them about different agricultural ventures: poultry, beehives, fish ponds, mushroom farms, etc. At the end of the learning phase, the interns will help each family design a plan of their own and give them a small (\$150) micro-grant to get started.
