Also introduced at that convention was "He Profits Most Who Serves Best." Both were adopted as official mottos in 1950 and Service Above Self was designated the preferred slogan in 1989. Since the early 50s there have also been annual themes, many of which mention "service," as does our current theme of "Serve to Change Lives."


