And the Winner is... – John LoBosco who won the football pool for his first time ever!

<u>South Portland Schools</u> – Our guest speaker, Timothy Matheney, became the Superintendent of Schools for the City of South Portland on July 1st of this year. Prior to his current role, Tim oversaw 14 at-risk school districts, including Newark, Atlantic City, and Camden, as Chief Intervention Officer for the New Jersey Department of Education. Tim previously led the Department's Office of Evaluation, where he was the lead architect of Achieve NJ, the state's comprehensive educator evaluation system. From 2004 to 2012, Tim served as principal of South Brunswick High School (SBHS), one of New Jersey's largest schools. Under his leadership, SBHS was designated a National School for Character, honored on the Advanced Placement Honor Roll, and named as one of "America's Best High Schools" by Newsweek Magazine.

Tim began his career as a social studies teacher in Toledo, Ohio before becoming an instructor at the University of Michigan and the University of Minnesota and serving as an Assistant Principal in the Minneapolis area. He is a graduate of Princeton University and the University of Michigan.

Although the transition from hybrid & remote learning to back to full time in person learning held its challenges, the SPSD was helped by the overwhelming number of vaccinated students, staff and parents and almost 100% adherence to masking and social distancing mandates. The school system has reported only 28 positive COVID cases or 1% of the school population.

Tim related that the greatest challenges facing SPSD are:

- Shortages in the labor market (transportation; education technicians, food service workers & substitute teachers are of greatest need).
- An increase in in vulnerable families facing housing insecurities (113 students in the spring, currently 150 students). Many have come from a long journey and have significant education needs. SPSD has a multilingual team that is comprised of a social worker and a clerk to help with the paperwork as well as support for 10 community agencies. At this time there is no food insecurity among these families due to the work of these agencies. Housing insecurity is the greatest concern.
- Pandemic effects on students' mental health & learning issues as a result of interrupted learning.
- Supply chain issues (food service and building materials needed for construction of new middle school)

SPSD partnered with Northern Lights to offer vaccination clinics. Once the vaccine becomes available to 5–11-year-olds, they will again set up vaccination clinics. It was noted that SP-CE Rotary Club could identify volunteers to assist with vaccination efforts.

Thank you to John in advance and a special thank you to Mike McGovern for bringing us such wonderful programs over the past year or so. Mike will continue on the program committee. Other members who already have joined the newly formed program committee include Mike Geneseo, Tiffanie Bentley, Sue Sturtevant, and Tom Meyers.

Program committee members will select dates every two to three months where they'll be responsible for that meeting's speaker: coordinating the appearance, introduction, thank you. In sharing responsibility in this way, the club will adopt a model somewhere between our single member coordinator of recent years (Bill York, Dave Bagdasarian, Mike McGovern) and prior times, when each club member was

responsible for the speaker on a rotating basis. Please join the program committee and help make the new model a success!

The program committee will hold an organizational meeting in November (probably by Zoom) during which it will discuss the types of programs we'd like to bring to the club. After that, its meetings will be occasional, perhaps a couple of times per year. While the workload will be light, we all know the importance of good programming!
