Congratulations to all Maine Women of Rotary, three of whom where spotlighted in the recent Maine Women Magazine.

Congratulations to our speaker a few months back Command Sergeant Major Gretchen Evans, who will be inducted into the U.S. Veterans Hall of Fame this fall.

Meeting in Person – Club members should have received an email from Club Administration Director Mike Tranfaglia about the proposal to meet at SMCC. The board will be voting on this proposal at its meeting on September 28. When asked why we were considering moving away from Purpoodock, President Dave reported that if we were to remain at Purpoodock, for much of the year we would be obliged to meet in the small dining room which was not deemed large enough to allow for adequate social distancing. Although Mike's email indicated a target date of October 6 for returning to in-person meetings, recent trends indicate that it may be later than that – SMCC is flexible and will allow us to start meeting there whenever we're ready.

<u>Clarification of "In Person"</u> – Of course once we return to meeting in person, we will want to retain our online meeting option. Please contact Mike G or Bags if you would be willing to help with developing the logistics of hybrid meetings.

<u>Legalized Marijuana in Maine</u> — Our speaker this week was Erik Gundersen, the Director of the Office of Marijuana Policy for the state of Maine. Erik was introduced by his fellow UMaine alumnus Mike McGovern, who informed us that Erik initially considered stand-up comedy but pursued an equivalent career, politics, instead. As a legislative aide he helped draft the state's marijuana laws so it was natural that he be appointed to his current position in February, 2019. Erik made it clear that his office has no position pro or con wrt marijuana legalization; their function is simply to "ensure the health and safety of all Mainers by effectively and responsible licensing and regulating marijuana establishments." Erik summarized the differences between adult use (recreational) and medical use, including changes to the medical use program which have allowed it to be more competitive with adult use. He reviewed the numbers of existing marijuana establishments as well as those with pending license applications — we're on track to have as many pot shops as Dunkin Donuts! He also showed us the growth in monthly revenue from adult use, which both generates tax revenue for the state as well as begins to make inroads on the illicit market.
