

The Culinary Capital of Maine! – John LoBosco introduced Kate McCarty, a SP resident who teaches food preservation for the UMaine Extension Service. She also is the food editor of Maine Magazine and has written two books, Portland Food: The Culinary Capital of Maine, and Distilled in Maine: A History of Libations, Temperance and Craft Spirits. She discussed her interviews with top chefs for the food book and their theories for why Portland has become renowned for its food scene. She also summarized Maine's prohibition history (Maine was ahead of its time - the first state to prohibit alcohol, back in 1851!).
