<u>Another Meeting Note</u> – Since we are tied to the SMCC calendar for our dinner before our regular meetings, please note that after this week, we will NOT be eating in the dining hall until January 18.

"Everything is Awful" – That sums up the mental health crises that we've seen manifested in the news recently. Our speaker this week was a "bad-ass social worker" who is part of the solution - our own Kiley Wilkens-O'Brien, whose one-year anniversary as a member happens next month. She informed us that 85% of people worldwide reported a decline in their emotional well-being as a result of the pandemic. And one in 5 adults experience mental illness every year. She described a crisis response framework that the state is endeavoring to provide:

- Someone to Talk to
- Someone to Respond
- Somewhere to Go

In response to the need for Someone to Talk to, this summer Maine launched the "988" Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. This is similar to 911 and will take the caller directly to a trained crisis counselor 24/7. Thank you Kiley for giving such an excellent and informative presentation on very short notice!



<u>Visit to Santa</u> – Tony Wagner reports that several members of our club picked up over 3,500 toys and children's books from an anonymous donor in Saco on Saturday morning. Thank you to Ray Healey, Jeff Gabrielson, Paul Smith, Mary McGreehan and Tony's friend Jaymie Chamberlain for loading the van that they borrowed from the South Portland Food Cupboard. Toys were partially distributed on Saturday to the Food Cupboard, Family Promise, Judy's Pantry, and St. Luke's Cathedral.
