While Dr. Munjal was in medical school in the 1970's, he had the opportunity to visit with patients and their parents at a polio camp in India. His experiences there inspired him to go into orthopedics. He kindly agreed to share his story with us. In this video, Mr. Munjal tells us what life is like for someone who has contracted polio (both then and now), why everyone should be concerned about polio eradication, and why he supports Flight To End Polio.

To quote Dr. Munjal: *This disease can be eradicated and the problem is real. I do consider that supporting this program is supporting humanity.*



June 7, Pakistan: An incredible day from start to finish!

Peter and John spent the entire day on June 7 traveling to various sites in Pakistan, administering vaccines to children at each stop and learning more about the vaccination efforts of Rotary International and UNICEF Pakistan. Vaccines were given at a resource center in a poverty stricken area of Karachi and on board buses that had arrived in Karachi from the north, carrying refugees from Afghanistan and the north of Pakistan. Each bus into Karachi is stopped at a military checkpoint for safety reasons and then Rotary and UNICEF staff can also speak with each family on the bus to determine vaccinate status, giving vaccines on the spot when needed.

Later, Rotarians from Karachi and surrounding areas greeted them with open arms at evening events and they met with top officials from the Pakistan Polio Eradication Initiative including biologists, dieticians, doctors, pharmacists, etc. A similar day was planned for June 8: more administering of vaccinations, visiting with dignitaries and local officials, visiting a clean water pumping station that supplies clean water to 20,000 people who would otherwise not have access.
