

<u>Maine Venture Fund</u> – Our new Program Chair Chris Speh introduced Joe Powers, the managing director of the Maine Venture Fund. Joe is a Portland resident who got his BA from Middlebury and his MBA from the Tuck School of Business.



There are only ten states which have lower capital investment than Maine, which is why the Maine legislature created the Maine Venture Fund. Its purpose is to invest in Maine businesses with the potential for high growth, economic development (i.e. jobs) and/or public benefit. They invest in early stage companies in exchange for part ownership. Since 1997 the fund has invested over \$25 million in 80 Maine companies; it has a current portfolio of 30 companies employing over 600 Maine residents at above average salaries. One third of those companies are in a Maine heritage industry (farming, fishing, forestry). Here are some of the companies that the Maine Venture Fund has a stake in – some of the names will be familiar to you.
