He started off by saying that he viewed his presidency with "gratitude and immense pride." Since it would take hours to recap everything our club did last year, he reported on the donations authorized by the Board on Tuesday (\$27,000 total!!!) as representative of all the good that our club does in our community (both locally and internationally).

- ❖ Boys & Girls Club our donation will provide healthy meals at the South Portland clubhouse this summer.
- Connections for Kids this is a mental health agency in SP serving children and families and offering an array of comprehensive services.
- ❖ Learning Works our donation is targeted specifically towards their YouthBuild program which serves teens and young adults who have struggled to find their way in the traditional education system.
- South Portland High School we have been providing ongoing assistance to SPHS as they address the needs of homeless students and their families.
- ❖ Habitat for Humanity our donation will help support building projects in South Portland we will be invited to participate in a service day this fall.
- ❖ WaYS we had a program this spring which educated us about the Wabanaki Youth in Science program.
- ❖ Bridgton Lakes Region club global grant Past President John Eliassen and future District Governor Emma Bodwell brought this grant to our attention which will fund an aquaponics project in Medellin, Colombia.

Wow! Jim summed up by describing our Rotary club as a family of kind-hearted individuals who lead by example, and serve as role models for our community. He expressed profound gratitude for the opportunity to serve – the gratitude goes both ways, Jim!
