MaineWorks + Maine Recovery Fund

Founded in 2010, MaineWorks is an innovative employment company with a social mission: to dignify the experience of people who face real barriers to workforce re-entry, including people recovering from substance use disorder and people with felony convictions. MaineWorks provides jobs in the fields of construction, carpentry, masonry, roadwork, demolition, landscaping, and more.

In 2017, MaineWorks founders, advisors, and other community leaders established Maine Recovery Fund, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides community support to individuals seeking to re-enter the workforce and to re-establish a productive life through economic viability. MaineWorks provides a job, while Maine Recovery Fund provides supportive services such as transportation to and from work and access to sober housing, as well as work clothing, tools, training and other items to help bridge the gap between hopelessness and resiliency.

Volunteer Driving Program Description

Volunteer drivers provide Maine Recovery Fund clients with rides to work from their sober house residences in York and Cumberland counties to MaineWorks' job sites (most are located within a 30-mile radius of Portland, Saco or Biddeford). All volunteers must complete and submit a Volunteer Driver Agreement, along with their driver's license and insurance information.

Once you have been approved as a volunteer driver, you will be asked about your availability to drive. Rides to work are generally required on weekdays between 6:00am and 8:00am. Ideally, volunteers will commit to driving the same day(s)/route(s) each week. Drivers are not permitted to make unauthorized stops and are to transport client(s) directly to/from job site(s).

Day-to-day coordination of rides is handled by MaineWorks staff who will confirm rides with volunteer drivers the day before the scheduled trip.

In the event of work cancellation or delay due to inclement weather, volunteers will be notified by the dispatch coordinator as soon as possible. No volunteer will be required to drive in weather conditions s/he is uncomfortable with.

Reporting mileage

In order to accurately track our impact, it is important that our volunteer drivers submit accurate and timely mileage reports. Drivers will be able to report mileage online using this <u>Google Form</u> (preferred), or by keeping a paper record and submitting that to the Volunteer Coordinator on a regular basis.

Mileage/Toll Reimbursement

Volunteers may request reimbursement of mileage and tolls when driving their personal vehicles. Mileage reimbursements will be processed on a monthly basis. Please contact the Volunteer Coordinator for more information.

If you are involved in an accident:

- Promptly seek medical attention if you or your rider(s) are injured.
- Report the accident to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- Report the accident to MaineWorks dispatch at the number below.
- Report the accident to your insurance carrier.
