"I think we have just celebrated International Women's Day – Emma was just great!" –

That was one of the chats on Zoom at this week's meeting (from Patty) describing this week's program. Emma Tiedemann is the Voice of the Sea Dogs, having joined them in March, 2020 – just in time to work from home! She came to the Sea Dogs from the Lexington Legends where she was honored as the South Atlantic League Media Relations Director of the Year. Prior to the Legends, she broadcast games for the Mat-Su Miners in Palmer, Alaska, the Medford (Oregon) Rogues and the St. Paul Saints. She was just the second female broadcaster in Minor League Baseball.

Emma credits her grandfather, who broadcast for the Dallas Cowboys and Texas Rangers, for getting her into broadcasting. He invited her into the booth when she was 15 and put a headset on her. Today at age 97, he listens to all her games and even texts her during the game to make suggestions!

Emma was invited to speak to us so that we could hear what it was like for her to break into broadcasting as a female (some team owners refused to hire a female broadcaster), but also to share her secret of why she's so good. Turns out the secret is HARD WORK! Emma spends many hours studying the Sea Dogs players as well as their opponents and compiles a thick binder that she refers to during the game to give us her informative commentary.

Emma's ultimate goal is to be a radio announcer for major league baseball. Hopefully she fulfills that goal – but not too soon so that we can continue to enjoy her here!
