OPENING WORDS – Ray Healey shared this with us:

"Given this time of year when thousands of students will be attending graduation ceremonies, I'm reminded of a commencement address by then New York Governor Mario Cuomo at Iona College that occurred 40 years ago. A speech that eloquently articulated Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self.

Cuomo did not speak directly to the graduates, but instead spoke to their attending parents. In doing so, he asked them:

'How can we tell these young people with confidence, the futility of spending their lives in the pursuit of the gathering of riches? That such an endeavor will not make them any happier or surer of themselves. That the closed circle of pure materialism is one in which aspirations become wants, wants become need and self-gratification becomes a bottomless pit. How do we tell them that the most important thing in their lives will be their ability to believe in believing?

How do we tell them the philosophers St. Francis, Aristotle, Buddha, Muhammad, Maimonides all spoke the truth when they said, the way to serve yourself is to serve others, and the only way to assure happiness is to learn to give happiness.'

The message espoused by Cuomo is quite simple. That the only wat to be fulfilled and happy is to give instead of trying to get. For in the long run it's NOT the one who has much who is rich, but the one who gives much."
