<u>Well Done, Nominating Committee!</u> – Quick refresh for new members (and everyone else too) on the nomination/election process, according to our club bylaws:

- ✓ The nominating committee consists of the five most recent past presidents, and is chaired by the most recent past president this year that would be Dave Bagdasarian.
- ✓ The nominating committee nominates a slate of officers no later than the last meeting before Thanksgiving, i.e this week.
- ✓ The president asks for additional nominations from the floor (there were none and nominations closed).

<u>TREES</u> – This week's meeting was all about trees. I couldn't begin to tell you everything that was reported but here are some tidbits:

- ▶ We all need to sign up for 6 shifts of 2 hours each. If you feel that you are not physically able to sell trees, consider contacting Scott to ask him to sign you up as a greeter, or contact Dan McDonald to volunteer to help behind the scenes.
- ▶ We have ordered 2,100 trees, which will come from the usual farm in the suburbs of Newport, Maine.
- ♣ Pricing is solely by height there will not be a separate price for "premium" trees
- ♣ We are recording sales on an ipad again, but using Square this year rather than Shopify.
- Newspaper articles have already been submitted (and one has appeared in the Sentry last week).
- ♣ Trees sold online will not be set aside for customers they need to come onto the lot to pick out their tree.
- ♣ We will have 400 gnome ornaments to give to children.
- ♣ We will have choral groups performing on 11/26, 12/2 and 12/17.
- ▶ We will be delivering trees to the islands again on the first 2 Wednesdays of the sale Casco Bay Lines is again transporting them for free.
- ▲ Tree sale hours are 3-7 on weekdays and 10-6 on weekends.
- Please try to take a picture of the workers on your shift and text it to Matt for FB.
- ▲ We have cleaned the cushions in the trailer so please don't set the chainsaw on them.
- ▲ Keep customers at least 5 feet away from the chainsaw (and customers should not operate the chainsaw themselves).
