
Queen of the Mist – DeeDee Wacksman stepped up to fill in for a program cancellation, and told us the tale of Annie Edson Taylor, the first person to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel, on October 24, 1901 at the age of 63. DeeDee used to live in Bay City, Michigan which is where Annie Taylor lived also, and that's how she became fascinated by Annie's story. DeeDee conducted thorough research about Annie Taylor and even gave her presentation dressed as Annie Taylor might have been. The barrel weighed 150 pounds and was 4 ½ feet high, with lots of padding and an anvil at the bottom to keep it vertical. Her intention in going over the falls was to become famous and raise enough money to support herself. Her trip over the falls was successful in that she lived, but unfortunately although it brought her a little bit of fame and fortune, it was not enough to support herself and other people profited from the adventure more than she did.
