<u>Sleep Well, Garden!</u> – A few members of our club's Gardening Committee (Catherine Callahan with Bret LeBleu, Sue Sturtevant and Bob Knupp) put our garden at Bug Light "to bed" recently. Before you know it, it will be time for all of us to help "wake up" the garden in the spring. Thank you to the entire gardening committee for all their work at Bug Light and Fort Williams over the past summer!



November 2 - OLLI – Sue Sturtevant introduced our speaker last week, Donna Anderson, Director of USM's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI). Donna also teaches a gardening class which is how Sue met her. OLLI at USM was formed in 1997 as a Senior College for adults to learn for fun and enrichment. In 2001 they were endowed by the Bernard Osher Foundation and became the first OLLI in the country. It is open to anyone over 50 for a membership fee of \$25/year. Course fees are very modest - \$50 for a 6-8 week course. There are no tests, no grades and no attendance requirements. Students can attend in person or via Zoom. OLLI at USM also offers clubs (special interest groups), day trips to museums, etc., and international group trips! DeeDee mentioned that she is currently taking two classes at OLLI and they are excellent!



<u>November 9 – Locker Project</u> – Tiffanie introduced this week's speaker, Kathryn Sargent, who has been Executive Director of The Locker Project since 2018. Kathryn described the beginnings of the Locker Project – a mom who brought in snacks for the other kids in her kid's class when she became aware that not all kids had snacks for snack time – to its evolution to a food pantry within schools that provides bags of groceries for students to take home to their families. (So far this year they have packed 20,000 bags of groceries!!) In recent years they have also added fresh food events and have expanded to Head Start families. She noted that they recently moved from Scarborough to a larger location (with a walk-in cooler that's triple the size) across from the new middle school site in South Portland. The Kaler School has fresh food events on Friday mornings at which our club has been invited to volunteer – it involves unloading the van, laying food out on tables and assisting the kids if they need help packing their bags. Please contact Kylie if you're interested in volunteering for this.
