World Polio Day! – Monday (October 24) will be World Polio Day and SP-CE Rotary is all in on supporting polio eradication. Today (Thursday) at 4 many members of our club will be donning their red attire at joining the Portland club on the Casco Bay Bridge for "Bridging the Gap." We had made tentative plans for "Pints Against Polio" on Saturday but this had been cancelled for the time being due to lack of confirmation from the brewery. Hopefully we will be able to schedule it for a later day. Our fellow Rotarian Mike McGovern is in Berlin this week attending the World Health Summit. At that meeting several government and non-profit representatives pledged a total of \$2.6 billion towards polio eradication to help fund the 2022-26 eradication strategy. This includes vaccinating 370 million children per year for the next 5 years as well as continuing disease surveillance in 50 countries. Some notable pledges include:

- Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation \$1.2 billion
- United States \$114 million
- Rotary International \$150 million (i.e. \$50 million/year for the next 3 years this will be matched 2:1 by Gates)

<u>**Peace Corps**</u> – Our speaker this week was the president of the Dover Rotary club, Megan Keil. Megan was in the Peace Corps in Tanzania as an education volunteer at an all-girl boarding school. Upon returning to the US, she became a recruiter for the Peace Corps and she currently visits colleges all over New England in that capacity.

At the beginning of the pandemic, there were over 7,300 PC volunteers and of course they were called home in 2020. Megan reports that they are currently building back up and expect to be back in the 7k range in a couple years. Rotary has a close relationship with the Peace Corps and if you look at the PC Areas of Focus, they line up very closely with the Areas of Focus of The Rotary Foundation.
