

<u>Preble Street Teen Services</u> – It's too bad that Dan McDonald doesn't have more daughters because they have both been excellent speakers. This week we heard from Leah, who is the Senior Director of Teen Services at Preble Street. Leah described all the causes of homelessness in youth and young adults and stressed that the vast majority had experienced some form of trauma before becoming homeless. Preble's teen services have four components:

- ➤ Joe Kreisler Teen Shelter (ages 12-21) —open from 8 pm to 8 am
- ➤ Teen Center Drop-in (ages 12-21) open from 8 am to 8 pm
- ➤ Teen Housing Program (ages 16-24)
- ➤ Teen Outreach Programs (ages 12-24)

The range of services provided by these programs is impressive - meals, laundry, health services, teaching them how to be good tenants, subsidizing rent, etc.
