Amani Children's Home – John LoBosco introduced two members of the Damariscotta-Newcastle Rotary Club who told us about a global grant their club is applying for. John Atwood is a retired Superior Court Justice, and Chris Hamilton recently transferred to the Damariscotta-Newcastle club from the Camden club. Chris recently spent 6 weeks at the Amani Children's Home in Tanzania which cares for abandoned and homeless children, many of whom became orphaned due to AIDS. However Amani is <u>not</u> an orphanage – whenever possible children are reunited with their families. The global grant from The Rotary Foundation is aimed at expanding early intervention and getting children off the streets sooner, especially young girls. The project cost is \$137,000 and the Damariscotta-Newcastle club has committed \$20,000, the most they have ever spent on a project. They have raised money from other clubs and have another \$50,000 to go.
