- Voters approved \$10 million in local funding and \$60 million in state!

What have schools been facing since March 2020?

Research has shown:

- Increase in absenteeism
- Staff shortages
- Mental health challenges
- Significant negative impact on academic achievement
- Higher rates of violence and misbehavior
- Disproportionate impact on underrepresented student groups

What we also know:

- Decreases in
 - Sense of belonging
 - Home-community-school connectedness
 - Staff satisfaction







Birth of the Community School


- Already partnered with The Opportunity Alliance
- Won 4-year ARPA grant from City of SP
- Community School Director started Nov. 2022





What IS a community school?

A community school is a <u>strategy</u> that organizes the resources of the school and community around <u>student success</u>!



Community School Priorities

Chronic Absenteeism

- Definition: Missing 10% or more school days (excused or unexcused, including detentions)
- ~22.5% of students in Memorial and Mahoney last year
- Tiered approach
- Essential question: What do students need to show up at school?




Community School Priorities

Sense of Belonging

- 60% of students reported they did not feel a sense of belonging at school
- Focus groups to understand this more
