

Board members in attendance were President Dan, Nancy Irving, Matt McAleney and Peter Bennett. Tony, Scott and Nancy H presented information about our club, Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation. At the conclusion it was decided that learning everything there is to know about Rotary is like drinking from a fire hose so it would be a good idea to have a series of presentations of shorter chunks of information. Brent and Nancy I are already planning the next information session. THANK YOU to Tony for opening up your home for this, and to the Nancys for providing refreshments.

<u>Speaking of New Members</u> – We inducted our first new member of 2024 this week. We have already seen Pamela Fox several times since she has been accompanying her husband Kevin Williams (no longer our newest member) to meetings. She owns Williams Financial Services in South Portland where she and Kevin are residents. In inducting her, Matt mentioned that she also has a background as a nurse. Scott gave a happy dollar because although she's a brand new member, Pam took the initiative to set up the Owl at this week's meeting! (So if a brand new member can do it without any instruction, what's your excuse!) Sorry I wasn't able to obtain a photo of her induction – I'll try to make that up in a future bulletin. <u>And Even More About New Members</u> – Members who have been in the club 5 years or more should have received an email from President Dan about a pool of mentors that Matt McAleney is forming. Please contact him directly if you are willing to help a new member become more familiar with our club and feel like they fit in.

SpringFest! – SpringFest co-chair Jim Britt reported on the plans that are underway for SpringFest. Sari will be coordinating the Friday night activities at Redbank and Jim will take responsibility for the activities on Saturday, May 18. We're mainly going with the "if it ain't broke" philosophy and keeping intact much of the structure of last year's event. This should make planning/preparing easier than last year. That's not to say that they don't have ideas for possible new activities – stay tuned to hear if any of them come to fruition. Like last year, there will be a gnome theme, which was incredibly popular last year. Thank you to Adrienne, Bev and Tony who are already hard at work soliciting sponsors.

<u>First or Last??</u> – This week we made it easier for our speaker by having him speak first, followed by happy dollars and announcements. Our incoming president Nancy would like to know if you have a preference for having the speaker at the beginning of the meeting or the end. Let her know so that we can accommodate people's preferences next year.

What's Happening in Cape Elizabeth? – I'll start out by apologizing for not being able to completely cover everything Cape Elizabeth town manager Matt Sturgis had to say – he provided a LOT of information about town business. He started by acknowledging former town manager Mike McGovern whose shoes were hard to fill, and former town councilor Anne Swift-Kayatta (I didn't write it down but I think he said she hired him.) Here are some quotes from him:

- * "Sea level rise is real." He discussed the project to disconnect Sawyer Road at the marsh and restore the area to its original habitat. This is a joint project with the town of Scarborough and was partially funded by a \$1.6 million grant. Each town will also be kicking in \$180,000 over the 3-year project (60k/year).
- * "Disinformation is not a help." He said this in connection with reporting on the status of the schools project. There is a committee studying this with two subcommittees: Communication and Finance. The mission of the Communication committee is to provide information, not to advocate, so that the voters will be fully informed by the time they vote on the ultimate proposal. There are currently 7 different options being discussed, which the committee will whittle down to three options following a Community Forum next week.
- * "Younger Mr. Bagdasarian has been a gem!" This was said while he was discussing the challenges of succession planning and the talented employees that he works with.

Some of the other topics he discussed were:

- * Kudos to the WET team, who were responsible for saving the four crew members of the Tara Lynn II when it ran aground on Trundy Point.
- ❖ The budget planning process the budget must be submitted to the Town Council by March 1 and will be voted on by the town on June 11.
- ❖ Property Revaluation The current revaluation underway has not been done since 11 years ago. Results should be sent to owners next month. In order to avoid huge jumps in property values, the town plans to undertake this venture much more often in the future, which new software will allow them to do.
- ❖ And of course, what everyone was wondering what's going on with the pickleball court? The new courts will be double the size of the old courts (there will be 8 courts) and should be ready by late spring.
