- ✓ *Tree Sale* Nancy Irving announced that the tree sale was a success. There was a debriefing on Thursday to help Jim Britt & Matt McAleney to make plans for next year's sale. She thanked a raft of people who made the sale such a success.
- ✓ **Bug Light** Sue Sturtevant will be forming a committee to make plans to celebrate the lighthouse's anniversary.
- ✓ *Community Grants* Sari reported that our new pilot Community Grant Program has been going well. The most recent awards have been:
  - o A defibrillator for the senior center at the South Portland Community Center
  - O Support for the South Portland Public Library "Monday Matinees & More," a program to help combat loneliness among seniors (but open to all ages). There will be speakers or movies the first 3 Mondays of each month; our donation will help pay for speaker stipends and refreshments. If you are interested in helping to serve as a greeter, let Sari know, or just show up at the library at 2 on Monday. - ✓ *Grants for Wabanaki* Hannah announced that we had made donations to the Wabanaki Youth and Science Camp, a medicinal garden and Wabanaki Reach, a virtual program on Wabanaki history.
- ✓ **Youth Social Impact Initiative** Kiley reported on this new program we have already made a small award to 2 young women who wanted to provide wellness kits for social workers. Another award is in the works for a young person who wants to create and are and literature magazine.

✓ **RYLA** – Kiley also mentioned that RYLA has started to accept applications for this June's
