<u>A Sweet Story</u> – Last week Mike told a story about his former secretary Barbara Ray (past president Kathy Ray's sister-in-law) who passed away a couple weeks ago. When he was District Governor in 2000, he received an allowance from RI for his expenses and at the end of the year he gave Barbara \$1,000 in recognition of the extra support she had provided to him while he was District Governor. She initially refused the money because she was being paid by the town anyway, but when he insisted she immediately donated the entire amount to The Rotary Foundation.

The Rest of the Story... Mike was at a President-Elect Training Session (PETS – remember the acronym, it comes up in a story below!) in Illinois last week and he was charged with going to 9 different break-out sessions to speak for a couple minutes on polio. By the 8th room, he was tired of saying the same thing so he got personal and told them that he was missing the visiting hours for his late secretary and told them the story above. When he came out of room #9, someone from room #8 approached him and gave him \$750 for PolioPlus, which they had raised spontaneously in memory of Barbara after hearing the story. Plus two people had agreed to match that amount. So with the Gates match, that's a donation of \$6,750 to help eradicate polio!

Northeast PETS – As mentioned above, several districts in Illinois and surrounding states held their PETS last weekend. This weekend presidents-elect from our own district as well as six other New England districts are participating in PETS in Newton, Mass. Our P-E Nancy Irving flew in from California just to attend this training session, and she got the opportunity to meet the income RI President Stephanie Urchick from McMurray, Pennsylvania. <u>Maine Trust for Local News</u> – I wish you all could have attended this week's meeting to hear Stefanie Manning because I have way more in my notes than I can cover in the bulletin. Stefanie has been with the paper since 2013 and is now the Chief of Staff for Maine Trust for Local News (MTLN). She lives in Cape Elizabeth with her husband and two daughters and co-produces Harvest on the Harbor with Jim & Gillian Britt.

She told us not only about MTLN but also about the National Trust for Local News which is their parent non-profit company. The National Trust has only been around for two years and has two other state trusts currently (CO & GA) with 13 others in the works. Their goal is to have a subsidiary trust in every state. Maine accounts for 400 of the total 500 national employees so Maine, in the Dirigo fashion, is basically writing the playbook for the other states.

The MTLN is currently in the midst of a 2-year project to merge the administration of 5 daily papers and 17 community papers; Stefanie plays a big part in this transformation. Their goal is to have a reporter in every community that their papers serve. Since one of their papers is the SP Sentry, she gave kudos to its reporter Rebecca Richards. (And although the Cape Courier is not one of their papers, they are a print customer of MTLN.)

Finally, a tip for all you digital subscribers – you're allowed to add family members to your subscription, which many in attendance were not aware of.
