<u>The Man (and Woman) in the Arena</u> – For her opening words, Tiffanie recounted the starfish story which many are familiar with (and always inspiring) and also provided this quotation from Theodore Roosevelt, dated April 23, 1910 called "The Man in the Arena:"

"It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is not effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat."

I'm not sure if she had our SpringFest co-chairs Jim and Sari in mind when she selected this but as I typed it out, it struck me that they are our man and woman in the arena right now. Let's hope there's no "sweat and blood" involved tomorrow and Saturday, but they definitely have "great enthusiasms" and I'm sure that they will experience the "triumph of high achievement" when the community comes out to participate in SpringFest!

Our meeting this week was a preview of SpringFest. You'd have to be living under a rock to not know that it's this weekend, and that it's gnome-themed, so I won't delve into it here. These are our "marching orders" from co-chair Jim Britt:
