He is now a volunteer for the AARP Speaker's Bureau. Andy and his wife are Midwesterners who decided to move to Maine when he got a job with Sari's company – he thanked Sari profusely and said it was the "best decision ever." Andy explained to us that the internet is "a messy patchwork that has been assembled over decades, and is held together with the digital equivalent of Scotch tape and bubble gum." Some of Andy's tips:

- > Don't respond to unexpected messages.
- > Beware of emotional entanglements (is your grandchild really in jail????).
- Block spam calls (go into your phone settings and turn on "silence unknown caller."
- Enable automatic updates.
- Set up alerts on all your financial accounts.
- Use two-factor authentication.
